Getting Back to 'Normal'

The plan to go back to 'normal' is not official yet and is subject to change as the Covid regulations change.

In-house Saturday services are being held and are working out very well. High Holiday services are expected to be fully held in-house with Zooming for those who are unable to attend. By October, it is anticipated services, Minyanaires' bagels, and Men's Club breakfasts will go back to relative normalcy.

If the projection for relative normalcy by October occurs, restarting of Bingo and Pull Tabs, the major congregation fundraisers representing fifteen to twenty percent of operating expenses, could also begin. However, this restart will require the commitment of not only past volunteers but also new volunteers. A meeting will be held by late August with those interested in becoming a Bingo/Pull Tab volunteer.



Baruch de Spinoza is a young merchant, philosopher, and the heir apparent to the Chief Rabbi of Amsterdam, Saul Mortera. However, Amsterdam Sephardic Jews made a fatal arrangement with the city as they agreed to police their own community for unorthodox beliefs. When the city accuses Spinoza of atheism, Rabbi Mortera summons him to the synagogue to defend himself. Spinoza's best friend, his sister, and the woman he loves are all drawn into the controversy, a historical event that shook up not only the entire Jewish community of Amsterdam, but changed Spinoza's and Mortera's lives—and all of Western thought—irrevocably. No written record survives of

what was said at Temple Talmud Torah on July 27, 1656.



The play New Jerusalem is a reimagining of the interrogation and eventual excommunication of Spinoza that day. In this eloquent and masterful drama, playwright David Ives attempts to open the temple doors and let us listen in on a dispute whose philosophical and political echoes still reverberate today.

Heart Songs

A Holocaust Memoir

Author Barbara Gilford tells the story of the Buchsbaum family's escape from the Nazi invasion of Czechoslovakia in March of 1939. The family was fractured by taking different paths as intelligence was not enough to survive and bad decisions could prove fatal. Their stories live in *Heart Songs, A Holocaust Memoir*, which creates the legacy of love and loss inherited by Ms. Gilford.

Grandmother Clara Buchsbaum fled to Italy in 1939 and found refuge in the mountain village of San Donato Val di Comino where the local residents sheltered 28 Jewish

where the local residents sheltered 28 Jewish refugees. Clara's many letters to her son, who had escaped to England, reflect her deep love for him and her relentless efforts to obtain a visa to a country beyond Europe's borders.

Photographs and excerpts from Clara's letters detailing her attempts to emigrate take the reader on Clara's journey from pre-war Czechoslovakia to her heartbreaking end. In telling the tragic story of the family she never knew, Ms. Gilford explores familial and psychological aspects of the Holocaust while celebrating the fortitude and resiliency of those who died and those who survived.

Ms. Gilford was a teacher, psychotherapist, and a journalist who contributed more than 200 articles to *The New York Times*. She considers the COVID-19 pandemic, while tragic for many, a boon for writers, artists, and those who find, in

solitude, an opportunity to grow, deepen, and expand their very "selves."
