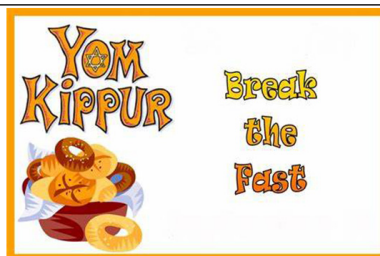

From the Desk of Rabbi Marmon

As I write, we are preparing to prepare for the high holy days. In fact, the entire holiday season is layered with increasing degrees of preparation for what is to come. Ten weeks before the new year, the cycle of Torah and *Haftarot* locks into a count towards the close of the old year, elevating themes of warning, punishment, forgiveness, and comforting on the national scale that foreshadow the work of repentance for each individual. With four weeks to go (about now), as we enter the month of Elul, the penitential season formally begins; we begin reciting the psalm for the season (Psalm 27) and blowing shofar – a warning alarm – at morning services. This is the time of year for *chesbon hafesh* (soul auditing!), reflecting on our conduct in the past year and seeking forgiveness from those we have hurt by falling short – including ourselves! In the last four to ten days of the year, we recite *Slichot*, introducing holiday themes and prayers, intensifying our anticipation, and giving us a last wake-up call before Rosh Hashanah.



Even Rosh Hashanah itself is a sort of preparation, almost a rehearsal, for Yom Kippur. We recite many of the same prayers and sing many of the same melodies, but with less intensity and of course, with meals. The day after Rosh Hashanah is *Tzom Gedaliah* – strictly part of a separate cycle of fasting to mourn the Temple, but in effect almost a warm-up for the long fast of Yom Kippur. Finally, Yom Kippur itself, the apex of the season of repentance as we practice it today, probably began its career as a day of preparation for “The Festival” par excellence, as the Talmud calls the holiday of Sukkot.

This is the season in our tradition for making amends for past mistakes, and making changes to steer away from future mistakes. This is not the work of a day, nor of three days. To make the most of this opportunity to rectify past and future takes an investment of meaningful time in our present.

It also takes an investment of our presence. We can experience Yom Kippur by being in shul on the day. But our experience of the day is informed, enriched, expanded, and made useful in our lives by the preparation that comes beforehand. And that preparation should include both the internal personal work we do during the penitential season, and some time spent in shul during the year. Without it, the holidays are reduced to unfamiliar ritual in unfamiliar language among unfamiliar people. When we make ourselves at home in shul with some regularity, as our busy lives permit, the people become our community, the extended family that supports us; the ritual speaks to us through the familiarity of the normal prayers we recite throughout the year, and through the striking changes in content and tone that make the holiday services so special and moving; and the language sings to us in the voices of our ancestors, even when we don’t understand all the words. Then we are truly prepared for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur (and Sukkot and Simchat Torah) to impact us with their full power to help us change for the better.

If you’ve been a stranger to shul this year, there is still time to prepare, though not much. And of course, with this year mostly in the books – there is always next year.

The cost of needed renovations were completely underwritten by generous anonymous donors. No general operating funds were used.

The cost is \$500 per plaque. In addition, one can dedicate a Prayer book to honor a special occasion (\$36) or a gold leaf for the vestibule's Tree of Life (\$200). - As our Mi Sheberach list grows, we are not sure if some of our congregants and friends still need to be on the list. Please call Lillian so that we can update our list and keep it current.

Cemetery

A few reminders from the Treasurer

It has been my pleasure to serve as Treasurer, working to make our money go farther to keep the Congregation flourishing.

Everyone should be aware that the Congregation can accept gifts of stock, if that is a tool that would work well for your family. Some people are able to send funds directly from their investment accounts, which is another handy device for making contributions. For those above the age of 73, as part of one's RMD (Required Minimum Distribution), those funds can also be used to make contributions directly to the Synagogue. If, for example, your RMD for the year was \$10,000, and you direct the custodian/trustee of your IRA to send a check for \$2,000 to the Synagogue, you would pay Federal and State ordinary income tax on \$8,000, not \$10,000.

Here are a few numbers from the fiscal year that ended June 30. Member dues, the High Holiday Appeal, and other contributions, covered 45% of our total expenses. The remainder as covered by investment revenue and fundraisers.

Let me remind everyone that we have set up two new special purpose accounts. The first is for security. For budget reasons, the City is no longer providing regularly-scheduled coverage for Synagogue services and events. Patrol cars from Saratoga Springs Police, State Police and County Sheriff will continue to drive through regularly. For this reason, the Board determined that regular security coverage is warranted. Accordingly, we are now paying for private security coverage for services, and other events. This firm is licensed and bonded. We have set up a dedicated account to pay for security. The more money we have in the account, the greater the number of events for which we will be able to offer security coverage. So please consider making contributions to our dedicated security account.

In addition, we have needed to make some repairs to our Torahs. Fortunately, there was no event that led to this damage, it was normal wear and tear. There are not many people who do this work, thus the cost of torah repairs is amazingly high. To budget for these occasional torah repairs, we have up a second dedicated fund. Please consider making contributions to this account as well. Contributions of any size are welcome.

In closing, I encourage everyone to contact me with any questions, ideas and suggestions. My best wishes to all for a happy and healthy new year!
